Re: Contract for Police and Fire Services – Recission of notice of termination

Dear City Manager Brimlow:


On June 20, 2025, I sent you a letter expressing the Broward Sheriff Office (BSO) concern of your rejection of the proposed consideration for police and fire services for the City of Deerfield Beach for fiscal year 2025/2026. In that letter, BSO expressed a sincere desire to meet with you to address your concerns with BSO's proposed budget for the next fiscal year, and to work towards a new agreement for police and fire services. The notice of termination in that letter was made reluctantly, explaining BSO's preference to continue our long-standing partnership with the City.

At the Commission meeting last night, the City Commission approved the BSO budget for police and fire services, based upon the original consideration letter that BSO provided you in a letter dated May 1, 2025. The consideration passed by the City Commission provides BSO with the funding necessary to implement the salary study that was presented to you earlier this year. Since the only reason that BSO provided the notice of termination was the rejection of BSO's original consideration letter, and since the City Commission has now approved that consideration, the contingency for BSO's notice of termination is no longer present, and there is no longer a need to enter into the transition period provided in the contract.

Accordingly, in consideration of the City's agreement to fund BSO's proposed budget for FY 25/26, the notice of termination of the contract for police and fire services provided to the City in my June 20, 2025, letter is hereby

rescinded, and the contract will remain in full force and effect, modified only for the consideration, until its expiration on March 31, 2026. During the intervening time period, it is BSO's desire to meet with the City to engage in negotiations towards a long-term partnership. BSO is ready to begin these discussions immediately.
