

HR 218 FIREARMS QUALIFICATIONS 2025

The Broward Sheriff's Office – Training Division is offering BSO retired DLE and DOD deputies, as well as other retired certified law enforcement officers that reside in Broward County, an opportunity to qualify under HR 218/H.B. 143, Chapter 2007-111. Former Broward Sheriff's Office deputies are exempt from the requirement of having to reside within Broward County.

Qualifications for retired law enforcement deputies and officers will be held at:

BSO Firearms Training Range - *Markham Park Shooting Range* 16001 West State Road 84, Sunrise, Florida 33326

The following dates have been selected for the 2025 calendar year:

FEBRUARY 15, MAY 17, AUGUST 16, AND NOVEMBER 15, 2025

The range can accommodate up to 20 participants per relay. Relays will be scheduled starting at 8:00 am, with other times slots added as needed. Qualifications will be conducted by BSO's certified CJSTC Firearms Instructors.

Please see the following requirements to participate:

- By Florida law, all costs associated with the demonstration by such person to meet the required range testing component shall be the expense of the person being tested. The cost is \$125.00 per person for each qualification session attended. <u>Broward Sheriff's Office retirees are exempt from this fee.</u>
- Only checks or money orders will be accepted. Payment should be made <u>payable to the</u>
 <u>Broward Sheriff's Office</u>. Participants may add "Firearms qualification, HR 218" to the
 note section of their check or money order.
- Retirees interested in participating must e-mail <u>BSOHR218@sheriff.org</u> to reserve a position on one of the scheduled qualifying dates and indicating which relay: 8:00 am or 10:00 am.
- Information will be posted in the BSO website <u>www.sheriff.org</u>. Click Announcements (front page) to direct you to link/page to download packet.
- Retired law enforcement deputies or officers who wish to participate must:
 - 1. Have photo identification showing proof as a Broward County resident (for non-BSO retirees),

- 2. Have photo identification issued by the agency from which the individual retired from service as a law enforcement officer,
- 3. Bring HR 218 Retired Officer Request for Firearms Qualification form completed and notarized, prior to attending a qualification session,
- 4. Agree that the BSO range rules and policies in effect will be adhered to by each participant prior to qualification,
- 5. Meet the BSO current standards for qualifications, which require the retired employee to regularly qualify in the use of a firearm (please see the attached Range Rules and Policies and qualification course of fire),
- 6. Use ammunition in the following calibers: 38 caliber, .380 caliber, 9-millimeter, 40 caliber and 45 calibers, issued by the BSO firearms (no other calibers of ammunition will be allowed),
- 7. Qualify with handguns chambered for the approved calibers,
- 8. Trigger Finger Release holsters are prohibited, e.g., Blackhawk Serpa-Type holsters,
- 9. Be prepared to have their firearms and holster inspected for safety and functionality by BSO firearms instructors,
- 10. Understand that firearms and holsters found to be unsafe or un-serviceable will not be allowed on the firing line,
- 11. Understand that BSO firearms instructors conducting the qualification will have the final discretionary authority to disqualify firearms or person(s) based on safety concerns.
- 12. Have at least two magazines,
- 13. Participants are limited to one firearm per qualification day (no multiple handguns),
- 14. Due to the time and round limits incorporated into the 38-round course, participants must complete it using a **semi-automatic pistol**,
- 15. Participants will only be afforded three qualification attempts.

Broward Sheriff's Office retired personnel currently residing out of the State of Florida and qualifying out of state, can contact the Broward Sheriff's Office, Employee Benefits section; in writing, requesting a verification of employment letter. Firearms Range Safety Rules

- 1. Treat every weapon as if it loaded.
- 2. Never point your weapon at anything you do not intend to shoot.
- 3. **Keep** your finger off the trigger and outside the trigger guard until you are ready to fire.
- 4. Keep your weapon on safe until you intend to fire.
- 5. **Know** your target and what lies beyond it.
- 6. Always obey all range commands immediately and without hesitation.
- 7. Carelessness or inappropriate behavior will not be tolerated.
- 8. No cellphones or other devices are permitted on the firing line.
- 9. Only go forward of the firing line when directed to do so.
- 10. Eye and ear protection shall always be worn during live fire.
- 11. Ballistic vests shall always be worn during live fire.
- 12. All personnel entering or leaving the Range shall safely carry all weapons.
- 13. All firearms brought onto the Range shall be unloaded, unless the firearm is worn directly on the person in an approved holster.
- 14. All rifles brought onto the Range shall be slung on the body, muzzle down, no magazine inserted, bolt locked to the rear, chamber empty, ejection port cover open, and on safe.
- 15. Firearms shall only be loaded and unloaded on the Range or designated area when directed by a Firearms Instructor; the muzzle shall be pointed in a safe direction.
- 16. Before disassembly, all weapons will be cleared, made safe, and verified by a Firearms Instructor.

Failure to abide by these rules shall result in your immediate removal and disciplinary action.

Updated FDLE Course of Fire

With the assistance of the Training Center Directors Association, Florida's state law enforcement agencies, the Florida Sheriffs Association and the Florida Police Chiefs Association, Commission staff formed a group of subject matter experts (SMEs) in January 2020 to help revise the basic recruit training (BRT) Firearms course, instructor course, and **in-service qualification**. The SMEs were responsible for developing content and providing feedback throughout the curriculum development process. They have made multiple recommendations based on research and data regarding officer-involved shootings, as well as their own experience as firearms instructors and sworn officers. The SME workgroup completed the nearly three-year curriculum rewrite after conducting several in-person workshops and field test evaluations across the state. The updated curriculum was presented and approved at the November Criminal Justice Standards and Training Commission meeting.

Changes to the Daylight Handgun Qualification Course:

- 38 rounds instead of 40 rounds
- Removed the 25-yard line
- New hip shooting and one hand shooting stages
- Personnel will lateral step when drawing and firing for most stages of fire (off the "X" upon threat)
- Passing: 33 out of 38 hits to pass
- Scoring: Targets will be B-21E(Blue Man), with the scoring areas being 4's and 5's

The Updated FDLE Firearm Qualifications will go into effect July 1, 2024 for BSO DLE & DOD.

Magazine Load Out in this order (Total of 38 rounds & 3 magazines):

- 1. Magazine of 13
- 2. Magazine of 13
- 3. Magazine of 12

STAGE 1: Hip and Two-Hand High Point from the Draw

From the 1-yard line to the 3-yard line; for a total of 6 rounds in 6 seconds

 From the draw. On the command of "UP", draw and fire 3 rounds from the hip; then create distance and fire 3 rounds from the two-hand high point in 6 seconds.

STAGE 2: Two-Hand High Point from the Compressed Ready Position

From the 3-yard line; for a total of 4 rounds(2 sets of 2 rounds); 3 seconds per string

- From the compressed ready position. On the command of "UP", step left and fire 2 rounds in 3 seconds.
- From the compressed ready position. On the command of "UP", step right and fire 2 rounds in 3 seconds.



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STAGE 3: Primary and Support Hand Extended from the Draw with Reload One Hand Shooting

From the 3-yard line; for a total of 6 rounds(2 sets of 3 rounds); 5 seconds per string

• From the draw. On the command of "UP", draw with your primary hand only while stepping left; then fire 3 rounds in 5 seconds.

Based off the load out, shooters will be forced to reload.

The shooting from this stage will be completed utilizing only the primary hand. "One hand shooting".

Safely transition the weapon to your support hand and return to the compressed ready. Support hand only. "One hand".

 From the compressed ready position. On the command of UP, step right and fire 3 rounds using your support hand only in 5 seconds. Note: Support hand only. "One hand shooting".

STAGE 4: Two-Hand High Point from the Draw

From the 7-yard line; for a total of 4 rounds(2 sets of 2 rounds); 5 seconds per string

- From the draw. On the command of "UP", draw while stepping right; then fire 2 rounds in 5 seconds.
- From the draw. On the command of "UP", draw while stepping left; then fire 2 rounds in 5 seconds.

STAGE 5: Two-Hand High Point from the Draw with Reload

From the 7-yard line; for a total of 12 rounds in 20 seconds with a mandatory reload

From the Draw. On the command of "UP", draw while stepping right; then fire 12 rounds in 20 seconds; with a mandatory reload. The reload must occur between the 1st round and 12th round.

Based off the load out, shooters will be forced to reload.

STAGE 6: Two-Hand High Point from the Draw

From the 15-yard line; for a total of 6 rounds in 15 seconds

• From the draw. On the command of "UP", draw while stepping right; then fire 6 rounds in 15 seconds.
